

Scam Websites

It has come to our attention that there are a number of websites that appear to be attempting to impersonate Prospectus, offering remote work opportunities. We believe these to be scams and have reported them to [Action Fraud](#).

We want to be clear that Prospectus will never charge anyone looking for work through us. It is illegal for recruitment agencies to charge candidates a fee for finding them work in the UK. If you suspect that you have been the victim of a scam, you should report it to Action Fraud. The service is run by the City of London Police and they are responsible for assessment of the reports and to ensure that your fraud reports reach the right place.

We are taking this matter very seriously and will continue to work towards ensuring this matter is dealt with as swiftly as possible. We also wanted to take this opportunity to highlight ways you can protect yourself from scams:

Always verify email senders, website addresses and social media accounts (including LinkedIn): Check the sender's email address, the domain name, or social media handles, particularly if the approach is unsolicited. A full list of our employees is available on our website, including links to their LinkedIn profiles.

Verify URLs: Before clicking on any web links in emails or social media messages, you can hover over them to see the full website address. Ensure it matches the official company address.

Sensitive/Personal Information: Never share sensitive information such as bank account details in response to any unsolicited communications.
